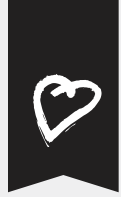

Rebeca Herrera lives in Montevideo, Uruguay. She is a mother of two beautiful twin girls – age 5 – who have both been diagnosed with Autism Spectrum Disorder (ASD) and a speech impediment. Rebeca and her children regularly worshipped at their local church, but stopped attending recently when her young girls were asked to leave their Sunday school class.

But Rebeca was in a local bookstore recently and found a copy of Friendship Ministries' *El Autismo Y Tu Iglesia* (Autism and Your Church). She purchased the book without hesitation and soon found answers to many of her questions: how and why should the Church become a place that welcomes families affected by ASD? How and why should the church include people with ASD in their ministry?

Rebeca also found a new call to encourage and support other families in similar situations. "This book awakened a strong desire within me to serve God in this capacity. I want to help others in similar situations and to share God's love with them," commented Rebeca.

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50 YEARS WITH FRIENDS

How do I begin to share my more than 50-year history with friends? There are so many memories, so many stories, and so many opportunities to share God's good work and grace.

Perhaps a good place to start is with Friendship Ministries' chosen theme for the 2014-2015 academic year: Cheering Us Forward in Faith. Tom, our executive director, wrote about this theme earlier in the year and referenced the "great cloud of witnesses" that cheers us forward in our spiritual lives and also in Friendship's daily work.

When I look at my life and my work with Friendship Ministries, it is easy to identify many who have cheered me forward in faith.

Cheering me forward...

I discovered my vocation while attending Hope College in Holland, Michigan. I was a freshman when I responded to a request for student volunteers to come and play with children who had intellectual disability. The children lived in a small house behind Western Theological Seminary, and I was thrilled to interact with them and a small boy who squealed and clapped every time he completed a task. I remember volunteering there beside several talented and gracious staff members who had a heart for working with those who had disability, and I knew I wanted to do the same.

But there was a small problem: Hope did not offer the education classes I needed to become a special education teacher, and I – having traveled to Hope from Northern California – was not looking to transfer to another college. That's when I found the first members of my cheering section, the faculty

mentors and friends who helped me select courses from Hope and Western Michigan University's extension program to follow my dream and to become a special education teacher.

Cheering others forward...

After marrying, teaching special education for four years, and returning to Holland with two small children, I read an article in the Holland Sentinel about the Reformed Church in America and Christian Reformed Church initiative to teach catechism to children with disability one night per week. This was an opportunity for me to return to my vocation and to cheer others – specifically children with cognitive impairments – forward in faith, while also being a stay-at-home wife and mother.

Cheering Friendship forward...

The rest of my history is very deeply entwined in Friendship's history. My dear friend, Marcy Vanderwel, and I were co-directors of Holland's Special Education Ministry (SEM) for some time. In 1979, Marcy and I were asked to have our program become the model for Friendship Ministries and to write the first three years of curriculum. We eagerly obliged and were blessed to be a part of Friendship's beginning.

In 2016 my 4th three-year board term will conclude. My long involvement with Friendship Ministries has been one of God's greatest blessings, and I will always cheer her forward in faith, as she continues to share God's love and grace with those who have intellectual disability, and as we enable them to become active members of His family. I hope you will join us.

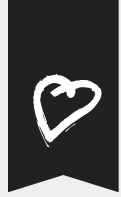

March 12, 2015, Anaheim, California

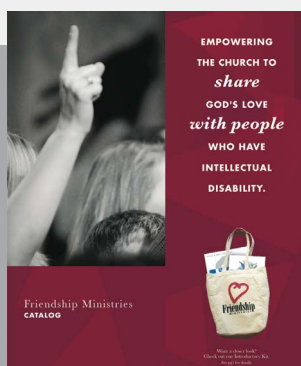
