About Worship at Granite Springs

Our worship flows from the words and life of Jesus, the teaching of God's Word, and the practices of the Christian church through the ages. Worship is a meeting between God and his people, with God as the initiator and we as responders. This dialogue begins with God calling us to worship and praise, prayer (especially the Psalms), a time of teaching from the Bible, a weekly celebration of Communion, and a blessing to go and serve God in the world.

About Music at Granite Springs

Our music borrows from the global church, the ancient church, the modern church. We sing hymns loved by our Christ-following ancestors, and Psalms that bring words when we have none. We sing truth brought to life by modern instruments and new, yet timeless refrains, and we value the good work of contemporary songwriters, both in-house and across the world, who thoughtfully craft new ways to sing old truths. We believe that all of creation is a good gift from God, and that there is sacred in the secular, beauty in the rough edges, and that God lives in places we may not expect to find Him.

About Offering at Granite Springs

We receive two offerings each week. The primary offering goes toward sustaining the life and work of Granite Springs Church. The monthly mission offering goes toward supporting God's work outside of Granite Springs, and this mission rotates monthly. We invite you to give either during the offering, at granitesprings.org, or via the Granite Springs mobile app.

About Communion at Granite Springs

Communion (also called The Lord's Supper or Eucharist) is the family meal of Christians. As such, all who believe in the love and grace of Christ are invited and welcomed to receive Communion, including children. Come forward by exiting your row to your right and approaching the elements nearest you. Receive the bread and dip it in the cup, and eat, perhaps offering "Thanks be to God." As an alternative to receiving Communion, we invite you to still come through the line, but instead cross your arms to indicate you'd prefer to receive a blessing. The bread used for Communion is gluten-free.



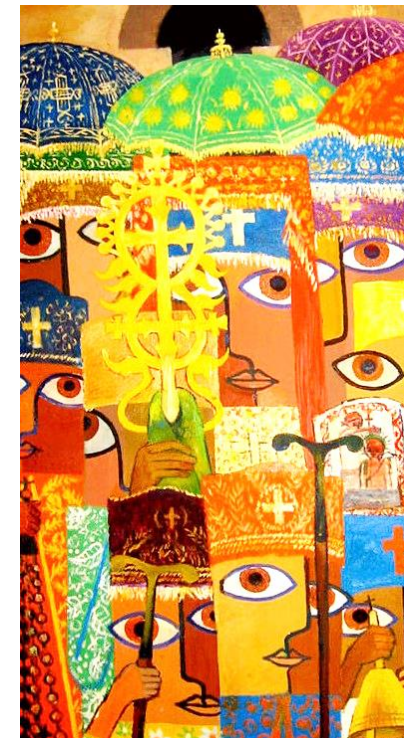
